## Tapping Into Gambling Funds For Your Club's ATV Trails & Safety Training (How to request funds from pull-tab operators)

***Second in a series on raising funds for ATV clubs.***

We love our pull-tabs in Minnesota...and our meat raffles and bingo. We also love our ATV trails and the clubs and volunteers that build and maintain them. Did you know that DNR-related projects for trail maintenance and safety education qualify for use of gambling funds?

As shown on form LG555, they are among the government-approved expenditures that organizations with gambling licenses can make, donating funds to ATV clubs that are 501(c)3 non-profits, possibly also 501(c)7's. Code 13 of the Lawful Purpose Expenditures includes: "Costs related to

grooming and maintaining snowmobile or all-terrain vehicle trails that are grant-in-aid trails, or other trails open to public use, provided that DNR has approved the project. Supplies and materials for safety training and education programs coordinated by the DNR."

**The organizations in your local area that have gambling licenses may be interested in donating to your ATV club. You just need to ask.**

According to the Minnesota Gambling Control Board, of the 1,146 licensed lawful gambling organizations in Minnesota, 154 are Lions Clubs, 89 are Hockey Associations, and 28 are snowmobile clubs. A couple of those - established in the '70s - are also now ATV Clubs.



The Mille Lacs Drift Skippers Snowmobile & ATV Club - established 50 years ago this month - has been involved in charitable gambling for many years. It has pull-tabs or meat raffles in seven locations in the Isle, Minnesota, area. It uses most of the gambling funds to purchase and maintain equipment to manage over 100 miles of snowmobile and ATV trails in central Minnesota, including the Red Top Loop, Foxy Trail and much of the Soo Line South Trail. The Drift Skippers club also donates gambling funds to many other non-profit organizations. The club has a policy that focuses on specific types of organizations it donates to, directs the funds locally, and

rarely accepts requests from other ATV or snowmobile clubs.

If it's a 501(c)3 non-profit organization, your ATV club could follow the lead of the Drift Skippers and look into becoming a charitable gambling organization. It requires a major commitment and the ability to follow strict gambling rules. **Questions?** Contact the Gambling Control Board at 651-639-4000. This form will be made available in alternative format (i.e. large print, Braille) upon request. The information requested on this form will become public information, when requested by the Board, and will be used to determine your compliance with Minnesota statutes and rules governing lawful gambling activities.

You can also contact the organizations in your area with charitable gambling, ask about their policy related to donations, and see if your DNR-connected safety education program or trail maintenance project qualifies. Some charitable gambling organizations prefer that you come to a meeting to introduce yourself and the project you're trying to fund. Others simply require that you submit a written request. It may or may not be approved.

"Keep in mind, the organization that does the gambling may have parameters, because they are using gambling funds to fulfill their mission," said Tina Chapman, CEO of the Drift Skippers and its gambling program. "Our mission is to maintain trails and that's what the vast

majority of our funds are used for."

If you get the green light to request funds, the organization with the gambling license will help you meet the requirements, including filling out the LG555 form. If your request is over \$500, they will have someone with the DNR, such as a Regional Training Officer or Area Supervisor, acknowledge that the request qualifies, and sign the form. 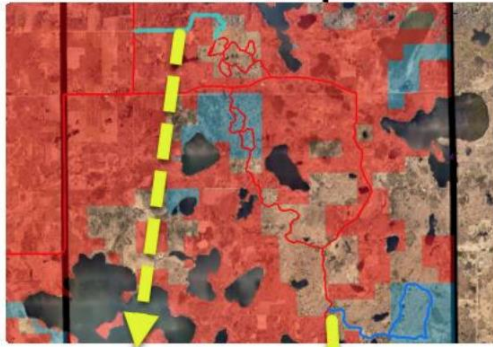

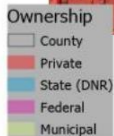
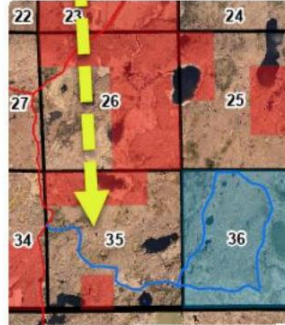
## Crow Wing County Seeking Public Comments

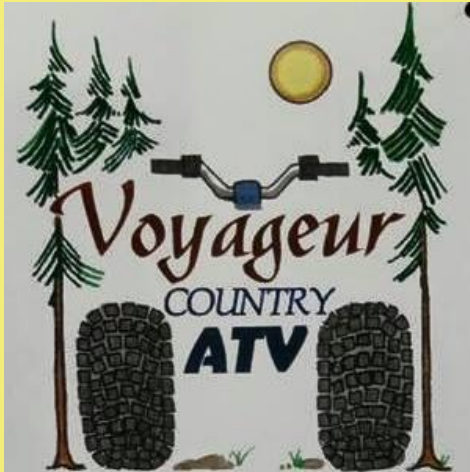
## Update On Vermilion Falls

### Trail Enhancements



*From Voyageur Country ATV*  
Our winter 2019/2020 project is improving 6 miles of snowmobile trail connecting the resort community of Crane Lake with the U.S. Forest Service Recreation and Picnic Area at Vermilion Falls, a popular tourist stop for almost 90 years. Two years ago, Voyageur Country ATV constructed new picnic sites at the Falls. Now we are working on the multi-use snowmobile/ATV trail connecting to it, getting riders off the road and into the woods.

The project is basically hardening and shaping the trail and adding culverts where appropriate. We have cut a couple new re-routes on higher ground to eliminate the need to cross some wetlands. This will also improved the snowmobile trail.



The main feature of the trail project is another new bridge or "elevated boardwalk." The bridge will be over 260' ft. in length and 12 ft. wide, crossing a wetland and beaver dam area on the western side. The bridge is wood construction and heavy-duty to accommodate groomer machines, with a 10-ton weight restriction. It will have side rails about 40 inches high and constructed with 2-inch galvanized steel mesh. The bridge will be about 6-1/2 feet above the ground at center and will have a very minimal impact on wetlands. A good portion of the trail hardening is complete and the rest of the trail improvements will continue this spring. The

bridge is being put together now with an anticipated completion date of mid-March.

We are continuing to build out our trail system and have begun engineering, planning, and permitting on the next project -- enhancing 5-1/2 miles of the snowmobile trail from the VRT south to Shuster Logging Roads. Plus the club is currently working through the legislative process to secure funding to connect the City of Orr, Kabetogama Township, and Ash River.

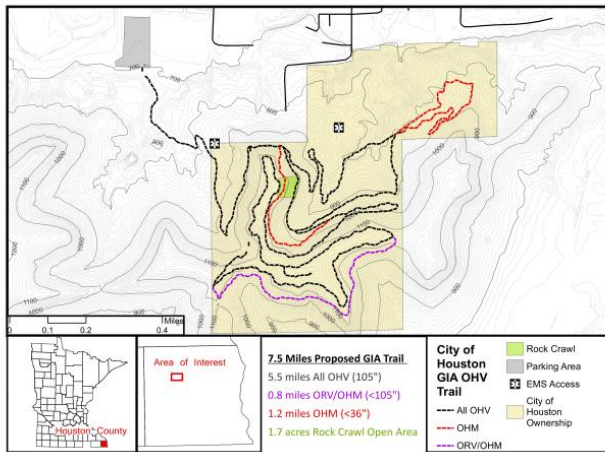

## **DNR Seeks Input On Houston OHV Trail Proposal**

*From a DNR press release:*

The Minnesota Department of Natural Resources invites public comments on a proposal by the city of Houston to obtain off-highway vehicle (OHV) grant-in-aid funding for an OHV trail. The proposed 7.5-mile trail, known as the Houston Trail, would be located in the South Park area of the city and would accommodate all-terrain vehicles, off-road vehicles and off-highway motorcycles.

In 2015, the city contracted with the U.S. Forest Service Trails Unlimited team to design a sustainable motorized

trail system. Sustainable trail systems provide an enjoyable recreational experience while reducing maintenance and potential impacts to the natural environment. The city of Houston and several OHV clubs would provide trail maintenance for the project.

The DNR will accept written comments on the grant-in-aid proposal until 4:30 p.m. on April 6. Comments may be submitted:

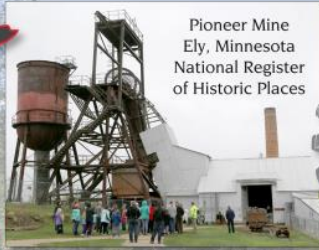
